- 1. Describe the contribution of Charles Cutter, Seymour Lubetzky and the 1961 Paris Principles to the development of descriptive cataloguing codes. (20 marks, 6.3 for each).
- 2. Discuss any <u>FIVE</u> (5) reasons for the development of the new cataloguing code Resource Description and Access (RDA). (20 marks 4 for each reason).
- 3. a. Define the term and list **FOUR (4)** types of access points. (2+4 marks).
  - b. Explain the concepts of main and added entries in AACR2R. (4 marks)
  - c. Give <u>THREE</u> (3) conditions under which the author is to be used as the main entry and <u>THREE</u> (3) under which the title is to be used. Support your answer with examples. (Marks = 6 for author as main entry and 6 for title)
- 4. The internet has revolutionized cataloguing and catalogues. Discuss <u>FIVE</u> (5) ways in which the internet has made cataloguing and retrieving information from the catalogue easier. (4 marks for each reason).
- 5. Define the term metadata and give <u>TWO</u> (2) reasons why metadata are needed. Describe the Dublin Core Metadata Element Set and elaborate on <u>FOUR</u> (4) goals of its development. (20 marks)
- 6. Write brief notes on any <u>FOUR</u> (4) of the following. Include in your notes, a definition or explanation of each term selected and a description of the purposes or benefits which may be derived from each. Give examples where possible to support your answers.
