Postgraduate Learning Commons

Prof. Elsa Leo-Rhynie Honoured

The UWI Mona Library has developed a new learning space exclusively for postgraduate students. The Postgraduate Learning Commons, on the middle floor of the Main Library, will offer facilities and services to enable postgraduates from all faculties, to work and study in a user-friendly environment.

Computers equipped with a wide range of software will be available in a laboratory setting where postgraduates can search the OPAC and databases; find electronic resources; send email or browse the Internet, and access specialist programmes with the click of a mouse. A photocopier, scanner and printer are located conveniently on the same floor.

The Learning Commons also provides a seminar room (capacity approximately 25) and 6 group study rooms, each with a white board. Students can also 'kick back and relax' in comfortable lounge seats in an aesthetically pleasing living room atmosphere. The facility is accessible to all postgraduates via swipe cards.

The Library has implemented SFX to manage access to its electronic journals – those we subscribe to either directly or in databases and those freely available on the web. There are two ways to access **SFX**:

During a Database Search

When you enter a search in a database, you retrieve a list of citations that match your search. A citation may include a link to the full text within the database. If a citation does not link to



the full text, just click the SFX button (located at the bottom of the citation) to start an SFX search for full text available from a different source. If no full text is available the SFX menu will offer you some alternatives.

From the A-Z Journal List

You can use the [A-Z Journal list](#) (click on Electronic Journals link on the Library's home page or go directly to

<http://sfx7.exlibrisgroup.com/uwi/az/mon>) to check if the library has access to the full text of a journal. Journals can be located by title, subject or by the vendor or collection. You can also browse titles by using the A-Z listing. When you click on a title in the A-Z Journal List, you will start an SFX search.

If you are accessing from off campus, you will be asked to log-on using your uwi_mona/students domain user name (staff/student ID number) and password.
