

- Data collected from our stations includes:
- Precipitation
- Max and Min Temperature
- Dry and Wet Bulb Temperature
- Wind speed and direction
- Evaporation
- Soil Temperature (1ft & 4ft)
- Sunshine Hours
- Radiation
- Grass Temperature

## Challenges Encountered

- Major challenges faced through in data collection:
- Shortage of Supplies (equipment)
- Shortage in vehicles and transportation
- Human Resources (data collectors & observers)
- Difficulty accessing remote areas (terrain)
- Communication (internet and phones/faxes)
- Technical equipment-Data storage

## **Our Needs**

- Office Need a New Climate Data Management Systems, Clicom which is the office main DBM for over 20yrs has become obsolete. The only management system in used is BDCAC- Regional Data Base for the Central American countries, which was created as a regional initiative to cope with climate variability impacts. Belize has more than 60% of its data stored in BDCAC.
- The office needs more automatic/agro met stations to place in remote areas, to allow for a better coverage.
