FOR QUESTION 1 DO EITHER 1a) OR 1b)

2. Explain with examples the stages of the research cycle as presented by Leedy. Comment on its value to a researcher.
3. Identify the characteristics of the survey methodology, and indicate with examples the context in which a survey is appropriate.

4. **FOR QUESTION 4 DO BOTH a) AND b)**

Identify and explain **THREE (3)** measures of central tendency, and state with examples, conditions under which each measure achieves the identification of the “centre” of a set of data.

(b)

For each measure of central tendency identified above in 4 a), calculate the “centre” for each group of data. Round off the values to one decimal place where necessary.
