39 **Dysphagia Incidence after Outpatient Anterior** Cervical Surgery Using Instrumentation versus No Instrumentation

The medical records of patients who had undergone anterior cervical discectomy and fusion and anterior cervical discectomy were reviewed. There was no statistically significant difference in the clinical outcomes of neck disability index scores between the groups. The incidence of dysphagia was noted to be 12% in patients who had undergone anterior cervical discectomy and fusion compared to no instrumentation.

57 Prevalence of **Methicillin-resistant** Staphylococcus aureus in the Surgical Wards of the Port-of-Spain General Hospital, Trinidad and Tobago

> MJ Ramdass, S Balliram, A Cadan, N Bhaggan, B Mohammed, R Singh, J Maharaj, A Boodram The prevalence of methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus in the surgical wards of the Port-of-Spain General Hospital, Trinidad and Tobago, was found to be 39.5%. Risk factors

included the age range of 60–69 years, patients with co-morbidities, hospital stays of over one week, previous surgery and prior use of antibiotics.

Evaluation of Mechanical Properties of Various 60 Nanofibre Reinforced Bis-GMA/TEGDMA **Based Dental Composite Resins**

N Tokar, E Tokar, B Mavis, O Karacaer The mechanical properties of Nylon 6 (N6), polymethyl-metacrylate and polyvinylidene-difluoride (PVDF) nanofibre-reinforced dental composite resins were evaluated in this study. Polymethylmetacrylate nanofibres dissolved in the resin, but N6 and PVDF nanofibres constituted fibre bridging across the matrix. All nanofibres enhanced the mechanical properties of dental composite resins compared to neat resin.
