


Acknowledgement of COVID impact

Jan 12 - China shared SARS-CoV-2 genetic sequence

Mar 16 – First Phase 1 CT starts for Moderna's mRNA-1273 vaccine

Mar 30 – Structure of SARS-CoV-2 published in Nature

Apr 23 – AZ/Oxford University ChAdOx1 Phase1/11 Study begins with 1090 participants

As at August 13, there were 222 Prevention and 1320 treatment registered clinical trials
