Why Geography | Geology?

Geography is the study of the physical features of the earth and its atmosphere, and how humans are affected or being affected by these, including the distribution of populations and resources and political and economic activities.

Geology is the study of the physical structure and substance of the earth, their history, and the processes which act on them.

We will teach you to use the GPS, GIS, satellite imagery, computer mapping and other technological advances to expand our knowledge of the Earth.
