- Supervise postgraduate research and contribute to the wider Geography teaching programme;
- Perform departmental administrative tasks as required by the department;
- Participate in curriculum development and contribute to departmental activities.

### Essential Qualifications and Experience:

- Applicants should have a PhD in Quaternary Geoscience, Climatology, Physical Geography, or a closely related field;
- Preference will be given to candidates with at least five (5) years' teaching experience at the tertiary level.
