The Sickle Cell Unit is a world-class clinical and research centre with its mission being "Improving lives of persons living with sickle haemoglobinopathies through Research, Clinical care, and Education".

The successful candidate will be required to:

- Develop research proposals to perform observational and/or experimental studies in Sickle Cell Disease;
- Acquire adequate amounts of grant funds to execute the proposals;
- Participate in and/or supervise research team(s);
- Interact with external stakeholders to facilitate translation and impact of research output; If medically qualified:
- Diagnose and manage patients with sickle cell disease and its complications;
- Participate in the development and updating of clinical care guidelines for sickle cell patients;
- Train fellows and students in the clinical care of patients with sickle cell disease;
- Participate in the new-born screening programme for sickle cell disease as may be required.

Essential Qualifications And Experience:

- Medical degree from a University recognized by the Medical Council of Jamaica, with post graduate training in Family Medicine, Paediatrics, Internal Medicine, Haematology or Public Health OR A terminal research degree (PhD, DPhil, DrPH) in a relevant research discipline;
- Evidence of a track record of grants and research output.

Candidates who possess the following will be at a distinct advantage:

- Experience in design, conduct and evaluation of cross-sectional, case-control, cohort and randomized trial design projects;
- Proven ability to manage field research projects and train project staff including paraprofessionals;
- Proven ability to prepare grant proposals and obtain funding;
- Experience in management of large data sets and conduct of multivariate analysis;
- Strong oral and written communication skills;
- Ability to interact well with students, staff and stakeholders.
