Why a UWI LLM?

This programme is especially well-suited for those working in the financial sector and serving corporate clients and those who wish to be better equipped to undertake specialized work in corporate and commercial law.

PUBLIC LAW

This one-year, full-time specialisation explores core issues in constitutional law and administrative law, environmental law, public international law, public international trade law and Caribbean integration law. This programme is well-suited for members of the judiciary, public servants, public law practitioners, especially those with an interest in appearing before the Caribbean Court of Justice.



ENTRY REQURIEMENTS

This programme requires a Bachelor of Laws (LLB) or graduates of an approved university holding a degree which includes such subjects as shall satisfy the Board for Graduate Studies & Research.

COST

This programme costs US \$10,000. The UWI also has instalment plan options available.

DURATION

The full-time programme is 1 year or 2 semesters (Sep - Dec and Jan - May). The part-time programme is 2-3 years. The difference between the full and part time programmes is the number of courses for which one can register. A full-time student may register for a maximum of 4 courses and a part-time student may register for up to 2 courses. Lectures are typically scheduled in the evenings.





HOW WE TEACH

A combination of residential lectures, workshops, seminars and modern distant learning techniques with the inclusion of regional and international experts.

DEVELOP RESEARCH

Students may opt to read for a Research Paper at the end of the programme. Students will be able to develop a thesis through the supervision of our strong Faculty. Students may get the chance to publish or present their paper at our many seminars, for a and conferences hosted by the Faculty.
