THE UWI MONA LIBRARY'S PARTICIPATION IN WORLD QUALITY DAY 2019

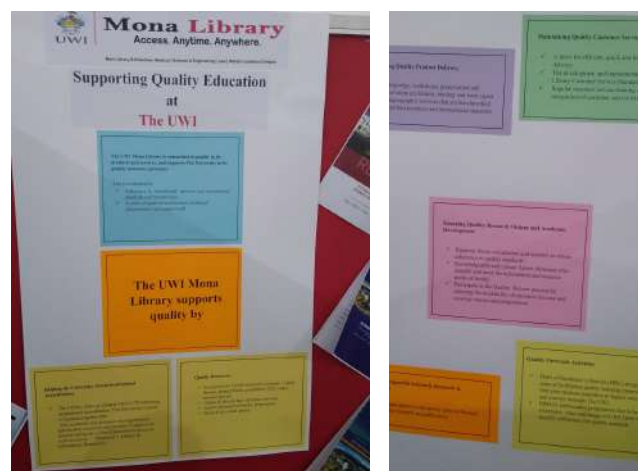


On November 14, 2019, the UWI Mona Library participated in World Quality Day 2019, held in the Tent near the Undercroft under the theme: 71 years of quality: your chance to build and influence UWI. The areas of quality highlighted by the Library included EBSCO Databases, Accreditation, Preservation, Predatory Journals, Halls of Residence Librarians, Thesis Scrutiny and Thesis Consultation.

Policy documents, rules, standards and forms, such as the *MLA Citation Manual*,

Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, *A Writer's Manual*, the *Annual Accreditation Report*, *Self-Study for Institutional Re-Accreditation*, *Research for Development: A Bibliography of Staff Publications 1998 - 2002*, the *Graduate Studies Thesis Guide* and the *Thesis Consultation Form* were on display.

Also on display were samples of products of the bindery, such as book covers, enclosure/conservation box, book cases and final bound theses. EBSCO Student Ambassador, Miss Jada Pink was present at the booth to provide demonstrations and answer visitors' question relating to EBSCO databases. A few lucky visitors to the booth received EBSCO-branded tokens, such as tea cups, pens and notepads from Miss Pink for their participation and interest.
