PREAMBLE

Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) enables an entity to determine its overall risk appetite, and to incorporate policies and procedures that manages risk exposure within such an appetite. The result is a more robust risk management framework, which, for a public sector entity, increases cost-effectiveness that is as important as profit-maximization for the private firm.
