



Scholarships and Bursaries Announcement for Caribbean Nationals

Graduate Studies in Disaster Risk Management and Climate Change Adaptation

The 'Enhancing Knowledge and Application of Comprehensive Disaster Management' (EKACDM) Initiative

The EKACDM Initiative is a five-year project whose ultimate outcome is the implementation of the CARICOM Enhanced Comprehensive Disaster Management (CDM) Strategy and Programme Framework (2007) to reduce the impacts of natural and technological hazards and the effect of climate change on men, women, and children in the region. The Initiative is scheduled to be completed by December 2018. It is being implemented by the Disaster Risk Reduction Centre of the Institute for Sustainable Development in The University of the West Indies, with funding provided by the Government of Canada through the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development (DFATD).

The Initiative has funding to support scholarships and bursaries open to graduate students in all areas related to Disaster Risk Management and Climate Change Adaptation. Candidates with interests in the following areas will be given preference:

- Relocation as a Mitigation/Prevention Measure in the Caribbean
- Development of Climate Resilience Indices
- Gender Dimensions of Disaster Management

ELIGIBILITY for Scholarships and Bursaries

- Must be a Caribbean national.
- Must have successfully completed an undergraduate (Upper Second Class Honours) or graduate degree at a high level in an area relevant to Disaster Risk Management and Climate Change Adaptation including Geography, Geomatics, Environmental Sciences, Coastal Management, Climatology, Gender Studies, Information Technology, and Business or Management.

- Must be accepted and registered in a PhD, MPhil or Taught Masters Programme at The University of the West Indies; students registered in research degrees (PhD, MPhil) may be given preference.
- Evidence of professional experience in any of the fields indicated above will be an asset.

Applicants for scholarships and bursaries will be assessed by a Selection Committee established by the University Office of Research at The University of the West Indies, in collaboration with the Disaster Risk Reduction Centre and the Institute for Sustainable Development.

How to Apply:

When applying, please include **EKACDM Scholarship** in the subject line of the email.

The following should be included in your application:

- A current Curriculum Vitae, including address and other contact details;
- A covering letter including qualifications, professional experience, preferred UWI campus for study, your area of interest for research/study, and full contact details for three Referees;
- Copies of degrees and other academic qualifications;
- A description of your current or proposed research (this can be brief for students now commencing their studies, but should be longer for students registered for more than one year). This should include a statement of the problem, brief description of research design and method(s), and the expected contribution to knowledge; and
- For students already enrolled in postgraduate programmes, the name and contact details of the Principal Supervisor for the work being undertaken.

Closing date for this round of applications is **May 15, 2015**.
