







Graduation Statistics

Graduates of the academic year 2004-05 were presented to the Chancellor on Friday and Saturday, November 4 and 5, 2005. The numbers that graduated represent a 5% increase over those of the previous year. The number of graduates who satisfied the requirements for the award of degrees were as follows:

Table 7: Graduates by Gender 2004-05



One hundred and ninety-two (192) graduates were awarded the First Degree with First Class Honours. Eighty-three percent (83%) of the first class graduates were Females. The male/female ratio for First Degrees is presented in **Table 8** and illustrated by the bar chart following:

Chart 8: First Degree Graduates by Faculty and Gender, 2005






