Principal's Report 2006





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There was an 8.2% growth in student enrolment in the Academic Year 2004-05, from 13,384 in 2003-2004 to 14,486 students, surpassing the 2.4% targeted growth set by the UWI Strategic Plan. Growth was evident in all Faculties, with a 34%, 21%, 11%, 8% and 5% growth in Law, Medical Sciences, Pure and Applied Sciences, Humanities and Education and Social Sciences, respectively.

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




Chart 4: Enrolment by Programme 2002 -03 to 2004-05



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One thousand and six (1006) or 7% of the 14,486 students enrolled in Academic Year 2004-05 were from Caribbean territories outside of Jamaica (vide Appendix IV), though this represents a 17% increase over the previous year. Not surprisingly, the majority of the Campus' registrants, 10,555 or 73 %, were females.

The enrolment figures for first degree programmes continue to increase significantly since 2000, the largest increase being evident in the reporting year when registrants in first degree programmes rose by 8% over the previous year.

Consistent with the strategic direction of the Campus, there continues to be a decline in registration for certificate and diploma programmes.

Postgraduate Enrolment

An analysis of the postgraduate enrolment by programme at the University of the West Indies, Mona Campus showed that there were notable increases in registration over the five-year period beginning 2000-01.




Chart 5: Graduate Students at UWI Mona 1995-2005

Enrolment in M.Phil programmes increased until 2004-05 when there was a 10% decline in registration over the previous year. Registration in Phd. Programmes, on the other hand, increased for every academic year for the past five years. Total enrolment continues to increase for postgraduate programmes from 1929 at the beginning of the five year period to 2942 by 2005. There has been, therefore, an increase in the number of persons enrolled in postgraduate research programmes up until the academic year 2004-2005 when there was a slight decline of about 1%. Enrolment in taught programmes has continued on an increasing trend. The 20% target, established in the UWI Strategic Plan, of graduate enrolment to total enrolment has been achieved and the Campus must now address the resource needs contingent on this enlarged graduate population.



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Recruitment Strategies

The Admissions Section of the Registry continues to recruit students from feeder institutions through school visits in and outside of Jamaica, and through campus events to which potential students are invited. Of particular note was the hosting by the Faculties of Pure & Applied and Medical Sciences, in collaboration with *Generating Genius*, of a London group headed by Dr. Tony Sewell, of 10 Jamaican and 10 British boys of West Indian descent. The boys were afforded exposure to university level experiences in science and medicine in order to stimulate them to consider seriously a career in medicine or biomedical research. The programme will continue for successive summers.
