A herbarium refers to a collection of preserved (pressed and dried) plant specimens that are kept under archival conditions. The specimens contained therein form a record of a locality's or country's botanical, natural history. The data contained on the specimen labels can be collated to provide information on several ecological and taxonomic questions such as, species distribution, ecosystem checklists and zonation. Primarily herbaria are used for plant identification. This process of data retrieval and collation is tedious with a physical herbarium and thus the virtual herbarium is an efficient complementary tool. Specimen images and associated label data are loaded into a taxonomic database and served on the world wide web for easy retrieval.
