WORK OF THE DEPARTMENT

CARIMAC reverted to pre-pandemic normalcy for academic year 2022/2023. Aligning operations to Phase II of The UWI's Triple 'A' Strategic Plan 2022–2027, the School focused on strengthening partnerships with members of the international academia and other stakeholders, providing research services to external partners, supporting the wider UWI community, collaborating with other departments in the Faculty and revising undergraduate programmes.

ACCESS

STUDENTS

In January 2023, the Campus Tender Committee approved the procurement of new multimedia equipment used for electronic news gathering, in order to expose students to new high-definition video formats commonly used for broadcast, web and social media content creation. The committee also approved the renewal of software subscriptions for the continued use of digital content creation software applications for teaching and developing creative and soft skills.

Mrs. Chevonnese Chevers Whyte, BFA Animation Programme Coordinator, was selected by a panel of judges as the inaugural winner of the Beryl Allen Teaching Award for Innovative Teaching, an award introduced by the Centre for Excellence in Teaching and Learning (CETL) in its 30th year of service and the University's 75th year. "The award recognises faculty who have demonstrated in a variety of ways their support of the learning needs of students, embedding innovative and inclusive practices, and taking a student-centred approach to pedagogical engagements."

The ceremony was held on Wednesday, April 26, 2023, at the Main Library's Multifunctional Room on the Mona Campus.

With the burgeoning of the Jamaican Film Industry, CARIMAC revised its BFA Film Production programme to align with industry demands for people with specialised skills in filmmaking. The approved programme will come on stream for academic year 2023/2024. From June 15–25, 2023, Drs. Corinne Barnes and Alpha Obika completed fellowships under the second period of the Erasmus+ Staff Exchange Mobility between The UWI and Birmingham City University (BCU), facilitated through the Office of the Campus Registrar, Admissions and International Office.

For AY2022/2023 a total of 42 new and returning students enrolled in CARI-

MAC's Master's Programmes with 12 returning students enrolling in the MPhil programme. Two new courses for the MA Communication Studies and MA Communication for Social and Behaviour Change were approved by the University Graduate Committee. They are:

- 1. COMM6403 Issues in Caribbean Media and Communication: Class, Race, Gender Ethnicity and Sexuality
- 2. COMM6404 Media, Communication and Caribbean Society.

Additionally, in August 2022, The UWI/CARIMAC and the Caribbean Broadcasting Union (CBU) signed a Memorandum of Understanding to offer courses in the MSc Media Management programme to CBU members as specially admitted students. The agreement is that participating CBU member organisations will expand The UWI Mona Campus' level of visibility across the region through advertising on their airwaves and other forms of electronic media equivalent to the cost per course per person (currently USD990.00) or any combination of courses. The intake for 2022/2023 were:

- Semester I, 2022/23: 8 registrations were received for courses in the MSc Media Management programme. Three students successfully completed the course(s).
- Semester II, 2022/23: 5 registrations were received for courses in the MSc Media Management programme with 2 being returning students from semester I.

Dr. Olivia Bravo and Mrs. Chevonnese Chevers Whyte attended the Department of Literatures in English's presentation and workshop on "Bringing Digital Humanities to the Undergraduate Classroom" held on April 19, 2023, in N5. The workshop was in collaboration with Create Caribbean Research Institute. Between March 17 and May 26, 2023, academic staff participated in the faculty's inaugural bi-weekly Writing Series as part of its ongoing strategic planning exercise to drive research and publications, build teams, and increase collaborative research, project development, publications and grant acquisition.

Dr. Steffon Campbell participated in a 2-day Regional Journalism Exchange on "Business Models and Methods for Funding Investigations", in Quito, Ecuador, which was held on September 8 and 9, 2022 and consisted of training sessions with regional and international journalists and media owners. The Exchange was funded by the International Republican Institute. In January 2023, he was one of 30 journalists to complete the Africa and Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA) member countries global health reporting initiative offered by the International Women's Media Foundation (IWMF). The nine-month virtual fellowship was designed to assist journalists to digest complex, and often unfamiliar, public health information, to enable them to produce evidence-based output on the Covid-19 pandemic.

Dr. Alpha Obika and Adjunct Lecturer, Ms. Yvette Rowe, announced a Call for Papers for their edited collection titled, *Culture, Cash and Class in Jamaica's Carnival*. Dr. Anthea Henderson also announced a Call for Papers for her edited collection titled, *Young, Digital and Jamaican*.

INCOME GENERATION

In addition to its self-financing programmes, CARIMAC generated income through partnering with The World Bank from January-June 2023 to provide logistical support in conducting a Country Opinion Survey in Jamaica, designed to obtain systematic feedback from key stakeholders in the country, to enhance responsiveness and to help improve its capacity to achieve results. The project generated income of \$1,540,000.00. Income totalling \$100,000.00 was also generated through the rental of Annex II to the International English Language Testing Systems (IETLS).

CONCLUSION

CARIMAC was able to seamlessly revert to pre-pandemic normalcy with an active and engaged student body and adequate staffing. With strategic planning and the creation of new partnerships, CARIMAC was able to employ marketing strategies to increase the visibility of the University that will hopefully result in the generation of future income, the awarding of more commercially viable projects, the creation of new opportunities for students and the increase in the quality of research output. The School continues to review its programme offerings and have acquired up-to-date equipment to produce students who are better equipped, well-rounded and industry-ready.
