OVERVIEW

The Department of Child and Adolescent Health comprises a multidisciplinary team of academics and professionals who pursue excellence in research, teaching, training of undergraduate students and postgraduate healthcare professionals, scholastic and professional leadership, clinical services, advisory, consultations, collaboration with stakeholders, public and community service. The academic staff comprises four professors, two senior lecturers, three lecturers, six associate lecturers (University Hospital of the West Indies (UHWI)) and twenty-four associate lecturers in affiliate clinical training sites. The academic team provides teaching, training and assessment for undergraduate and postgraduate students at geographically separate sites. There are administrative personnel and one office attendant. The Department provides undergraduate instruction in the MBBS programme through the Junior Clerkship in Paediatrics (part of the Aspects of Family Medicine course) in year 3 and the Senior Clerkship in year 5 of the MBBS programme respectively. Additionally, faculty deliver lectures and other instruction to courses in year 1 to 3 of the MBBS Programme.

The postgraduate programme in Paediatrics (Doctor of Medicine in Paediatrics) Mona (students registered in Jamaica and in the Bahamas) is harmonised in administration and assessment with the respective programmes in the UWI Cave Hill and St Augustine campuses. Additional postgraduate programmes offered by the department include the Fellowship in Neonatology, and the Post-graduate Diplomas in Loss, Grief and Trauma Management and Adolescent Health and Advocacy. Faculty members also teach courses in child and adolescent health related areas or provide research and clinical supervision to students enrolled in undergraduate programmes in Nursing and Midwifery and postgraduate programmes in Biomedical Research, Clinical Psychology, Education, Nutrition, Family Medicine, Epidemiology and Public Health. During 2021-2022 the department continued to pivot modifications in delivery of teaching, learning and assessment in congruence with the dynamics of the COVID 19 pandemic and government mandated infection control protocols. Central to modifications is minimizing risk of acquiring SARS CoV2 infection among all stakeholders in the teaching and health care setting. The department provides in-patient clinical services through two paediatric medical wards, the newborn special care unit which includes a neonatal intensive care unit and a neonatal high dependency unit. Out-patient clinical services are delivered through general and sub-specialty clinics in adolescent medicine, cardiology, development and behaviour, endocrinology, gastroenterology, haematology and oncology, infectious diseases, neonatology follow-up, nephrology, neurology, and pulmonology and a Paediatric Casualty.

STUDENTS

Describe efforts made to improve quality of teaching, learning and student development

The Covid-19 pandemic changed the teaching landscape. During 2021-2022 the department continued to pivot modifications in delivery of teaching, learning and assessment in congruence with the dynamics of the COVID 19 pandemic and government mandated infection control protocols. Central to modifications is minimizing risk of acquiring SARS CoV2 infection among all stakeholders in the teaching and health care setting.

Undergraduate

Teaching & learning for undergraduate Junior Clerkship students had to evolve to meet the needs. This included:

- 1. History simulations (using actors/simulated patients)
- 2.Introduction of clinical examination using locally made and culturally appropriate videos
- 3.Introduction of a Discussion Forum and the Collaboration with Smash Medicine in engaging and gamifying the writing of MCQ questions being used in formative assessments. Pilot of SmashMedicine Jan 2022 to May 2022 SmashMedicine is a collaboration with the University of Oxford (Dr. Benjamin Harris) and Department of Child and Adolescent Health (Dr. Andrea Garbutt; Prof. Russell Pierre), FMS, Mona; Prof. Thame and HPEU, Dean's Office, FMS, Mona https://uwi.smashmedicine.com.

SmashMedicine was developed based on educational research into gamification, question banks and question writing in education. Answering MCQs is well known to enhance knowledge retention (PMID: 25609761). However, interestingly, research showed that question writers perform better than frequent answerers in summative exams (PMID: 28866607). Others have also described this trend (PMID: 26450346; 25893940). SmashMedicine allows students to learn through both of these evidence-based methods. From quantitative research, we see question writers perform 10-15% better in summative examination scores. In this collaboration we aim to encourage question writing as a method of learning to benefit especially those borderline candidates who most need it. The Junior Paediatric Clerkship (Year 3 MBBS Programme) will be the focus of this pilot. Students will participate in weekly Discussion Forums and groups of 5 students will be responsible for generating 3 questions and submitting to the online webbased platform. Peer review of the questions by alternate groups of students will be followed by Expert Review by a content expert. The completed questions will then be available for formative assessments by all students. We aim to evaluate uptake of question generation, peer review, formative assessments, and student perception of the activity.

Teaching and learning for the undergraduate Senior Clerkship was optimised accordingly:

1.Hybrid approach to instruction — all lectures, tutorials, seminars were administered via the learning management system [OurVLE], while gradual

return to face-to-face teaching for clinical instruction on the hospital wards and outpatient departments.

- 2.Enhancing formative assessment utilisation of MiniCex for clinical encounters (eliciting history, physical examination of patients, management discussions, counselling), mock MCQ mid-clerkship for self-assessment and feedback, mock OSCE at some specified training centres
- 3. Customised tutorials/review sessions at specific training sites to enhance student engagement and learning
- 4. Asynchronous access by students to most instructional material via the learning management system (OurVLE)
- 5.Debriefing and opportunity for student feedback regarding the clerkship rotation consistently conducted at end of each rotation and any issues addressed
- 6.Academic and professional sessions on study techniques and ethics
- 7.Participation in community-based activities students at Cornwall Regional Hospital involved in Back-to-school medicals to strengthen ambulatory care and immunization competence

Postgraduate

Professor Russell Pierre, the University Examiner for the DM Paediatrics Programme facilitated Cross Campus Examiners consultations to enhance the harmonization of the DM Paediatrics Programme across the campus sites in the FMS, and overseed the implementation and administration of the virtual DM Paediatrics clinical/oral examinations (Nov/Dec 2021; May/ Jun 2022). The written component of the DM Paediatrics examination was administered electronically for the first time at four regional sites during the May/Jun 2022 exam cycle. Drs Abigail Harrison and Andrea Garbutt, lecturers, executed the virtual DM Clinical/Oral Examinations Nov/Dec 2021 and May/June 2022 across four campuses and with the remote participation of the External Examiner in Scotland. These activities included examiner and candidate training and mock examinations for all participants using the virtual space. Communication to all stakeholders particularly students was paramount. Students were administered mock examinations to enable their familiarisation with the online examination portal and virtual oral/ clinical examination encounters Online DM Paediatric lectures/seminars were conducted regionally (cross-campus collaboration) as well as invited international series
