WORK OF THE DEPARTMENT

The department continues to make great strides in Teaching and Research & Service activities. The new format MBBS Clinical examinations (OSCE) across all 4 campuses was improved upon with the use of the Domain Marking System in May/June 2016. Our Associate Lecturers from our affiliate accredited hospitals of Cornwall Regional Hospital, Mandeville Regional Hospital, Spanish Town Hospital and Victoria Jubilee Hospital & The May Pen Hospital continue to give indispensible support to the department as the numbers of undergraduate students continue to grow. Our cadre of staff increased with the addition of two new Associate Lecturers for the Labour Ward and one new Associate Lecturer for the Gynaecological Oncology Team.

Our services include general Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Reproductive Endocrinology and Assisted Reproduction, Gynaecological Oncology and Perinatal services.

OBSTETRIC PERINATAL SERVICE

This service manages high risk Obstetric cases and accepts referrals from the rest of the island. The Unit provides teaching for postgraduate and undergraduate medical students. Perinatal Audits occur monthly as a joint meeting with the Department of Child Health and annual conference in February of each year is run by the High Risk Obstetric team in collaboration with the Neonatologists & Neonatal Pathologists.

The Labour Ward and Postnatal Services are supervised by Drs. Michelle Campbell and Lenroy Bryan who also teach undergraduate and postgraduate students as well as midwives in training. The first multidisciplinary training course in Obstetrics Skills and Drills was held in March 2016 and was led by two physicians from Dundee University, Scotland. It consisted of a two day workshop – training of trainers on Day 1 and a twenty participant (multidisciplinary) workshop on Day 2.

We launched the first clinical Fellowship Programme in Materno-Fetal Medicine and Emergency Obstetrics in July 2015 with 3 Fellows and the second cohort started in July 2016 with 2 Fellows. The primary thrust of this fellowship programme is to train persons to lead High Risk Obstetric Teams & High Dependency Units across Jamaica. This Fellowship Programme is spearheaded by Dr. Tiffany Hunter Greaves.

The Department offers Obstetric Ultrasound Services to both the University Hospital and referrals from outside the University. Ultrasound courses are offered twice a year through the PROMAC initiative. Ultrasound training is spearheaded by Dr. Nadine Johnson and Dr. Tiffany Hunter.

Oncology Unit

Dr. Taylor and Dr. Bambury are the two trained gynaecological Oncologists in the department and together with Dr. Rattray, Dr. Mitchell and Dr. Medley, form the Gynaecological Oncology Team. They are assisted by Sister Murdoch and her team of nurses as well as administrative secretary, Miss Thompson. Residents rotate through the unit spending 2 months in the Colposcopy and Oncology areas. Patients requiring colposcopy in the management of the abnormal cervical smear are seen in the Colposcopy clinics while patients with gynaecological malignancies, are seen in the Oncology clinic both in preparation for surgery and in following patients post surgery, post chemotherapy and radiation therapy. The Unit also has facilities for teaching both undergraduate and postgraduate students. A new Fellowship Programme in Gynaecological Oncology is in development.

FERTILITY MANAGEMENT UNIT

Dr. Vernon DaCosta took over as Director of the Unit following the retirement of Professor Joseph Frederick. The team in the Unit consists of Drs. Shaun Wynter, John Harriott, Loxley Christie and Sharifa Frederick as clinicians and Dr. Audrey Pottinger and Sister McKenzie as counselors. Two other staff members in the programme are Miss Denise Everett, a senior embryologist (Biologist) and Miss Hillary Walters a staff Nurse as the coordinator of the programme. This team has championed the In Vitro Fertilization and Embryo Transfer Programme for Jamaica and the Caribbean. Pregnancy rates continue to improve and frozen embryos and donor eggs are now being stored. Minimally invasive procedures such as hysteroscopy and laparoscopy (both diagnostic and therapeutic procedures) are provided as day case procedures and the family planning clinic offers contraceptive and sterilization advice.
