

MISSION STATEMENT

The Caribbean Institute for Mental Health & Substance Abuse (CARIMENSA), a Centre in the Faculty of Medical Sciences at the University of the West Indies, (UWI) is the country's only public health mental health facility and is responsible for implementing projects for research, therapeutics and social development.

INTRODUCTION

CARIMENSA was established as a Centre within the Faculty of Medical Sciences in February 2008 with supportive relationships to the Section of Psychiatry in the Department of Community Health and Psychiatry. The Executive Director of CARIMENSA is Professor Emeritus Frederick W. Hickling of the Department of Community Health and Psychiatry.

The proposal to develop the Caribbean Institute of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (CARIMENSA) was developed in the Section of Psychiatry in 2003 and approved by the Faculty of Medical Sciences in 2004 as the vehicle for the development of Cultural Therapy at the UWI and the training of postgraduate students in this novel mental health therapeutic instrument pioneered in Jamaica. In 2005 this proposal was presented to UWI Mona F&GPC as a part of the Strategic Transformation Team's New Initiative Budget. The Mona F&GPC approved a budget of J\$5.2M as an establishment grant for this Institute for the Academic Year 2005–2006., and on May 30, 2006 established that CARIMENSA would be located in the FMS, with budgetary control by the Bursar UWI Mona.

The CARIMENSA Press was established in 2007 as a publication organ of CARIMENSA to serve the publication of books and journals on mental health in the Caribbean, an area that is underserved in the region. Since its inception, CARIMENSA Press has published seven books on mental health issues in the Caribbean

PRIVATE/PUBLIC PARTNERSHIP

CARIMENSA has engaged in a private/public partnership with Psychotherapy Associates Ltd, one of the leading private medical research organizations in Jamaica (Figueroa & Henry Lee 1998). Psychotherapy Associates Ltd is managed by Collective productions Ltd and is located at Connolley House, the home of the Non-Governmental Organization Bond-Hickling Cultural Institute. This collaboration has facilitated the development of CARIMENSA as a self–sustaining organization within the UWI, in keeping with its remit from the F&GPC UWI. Connolley House has provided office and classroom facilities, administrative and utility support for this fledgling UWI Institute.

ORGANIZATION

On August 23, 2017, at a meeting with the new Dean of the FMS, Dr Tomlin Paul, Professor Hickling, Dr. Geoffrey Walcott, and Dr. Christopher Charles, the legal origin and organizational structure of CARIMENSA were reviewed. It was agreed that the Dean's Office would pursue the legal incorporation of CARIMENSA as a legally constituted non-profit company limited by guarantor in the FMS as stipulated by the F&GPC in 2006. The Executive Director and the CARIMENSA team would update the CARIMENSA terms of reference of the operations and functions of the organization.

MEMBERSHIP OF CARIMENSA

In keeping with its mission, cross-faculty membership of CARIMENSA is voluntary from any member of staff or student from any Department of any Faculty of the UWI; in addition it is community orientated with membership from all segments of the public. The requirements for membership are:

- 1. Active involvement in any research or other CARIMENSA activity
- 2. Attendance at the weekly CARIMENSA Research Meeting weekly (60% attendance per annum)
