WORK OF THE DEPARTMENT

The period under review was shaped by emergence out of the pandemic of SARS-CoV-2 which saw the department heavily involved in testing for the virus. Although we experienced a decline in the number of cases, the Department of Microbiology continued to play a vital role in post pandemic surveillance for SARS-CoV-2, influenza and other respiratory viruses. Furthermore, staff was involved in mitigating the rate of transmission of the virus through advocacy, outreach, public education and participation in control activities with the UWI, UHWI and the private sector.

ACCESS

STUDENTS

The department continued its work in undergraduate teaching across the programs of the FMS including the MBBS/DDS, nursing, physical therapy and PharmD. We returned to full face to face delivery of our programmes in keeping with the campus policies.

In addition, the department continued training in the PhD, MPhil, DM, and MSc programs with face to face because of small class size and adequate social distancing.

Postgraduate Diploma in Infection Prevention and Control

Despite high demand we were unable to deliver the self-financing Postgraduate Diploma program in Infection Prevention and Control due to staffing issue. We continue to work with the campus management to re-introduce this highly successful program. Despite this, the department's infection prevention and control activities continue with the University Hospital of the West Indies to the benefit of patients and the teaching and research enterprises. Professor Alison Nicholson

was recognized for her work in this area by conferral of the Order of Distinction (Commander Class).

The Caribbean Association of Clinical Microbiologists (CACM) continued through a series of symposia which addressed crucial pandemic responses while keeping the focus on key areas of medical microbiology such as antimicrobial resistance.

NEW STAFF

Dr Tiffany Butterfield and Dr Jerome Walker joined the department as Temporary Lecturers and have been involved in improving the Clinical Immunology Services while teaching conducting research in the area.

Abbott Pandemic Defense

Dr Joshua Anzinger continued as local Principal Investigator of the Abbott Pandemic Defense Coalition which is a consortium of 87 universities and research centers which are involved in virus discovery and surveillance. Among the projects which have resulted from this:

- 1. Virus surveillance and discovery in humans;
- Virus surveillance and discovery in mosquito vectors led by Dr Simone Sandiford (BMS);
- 3. The association between viral infections including SARS-CoV-2 and HTLV-1 and the development of autoimmunity;
- 4. The APDC supports the research of several graduate students and junior faculty members, resulting in publication in high impact factor journals.

Global Infectious Diseases Research Training Program (GIDRTP) completed its fifth year with three pre-doctoral and three postdoctoral scholars. The pandemic of COVID-19 not only curtailed travel to laboratories and institutes in the USA but interrupted the global supply chain which made the procurement of equipment and reagents severely challenging. This resulted in unspent funds in the grant and the NIH has granted permission to expend funds. Furthermore, we successfully competed for renewal of the grant for another five years and two new scholars were recruited including Dr Jerome Walker (postdoctoral fellow) and Ms Shanice Redman (pre doctoral fellow). Dr Walker's project is entitled Clinical and immunological outcomes of dengue fever outbreak in hospitalized children at a tertiary healthcare center in Jamaica while Ms Redman will study Phylogenetic analysis and genotype identification of dengue virus whole genome sequences obtained from serum samples of patients presenting to the University Hospital of the West Indies, Jamaica

Antimicrobial resistance remains a key are of research in the department and is inextricably linked to the teaching and clinical service. The introduction of Next Generation Sequencing in the department has expanded the potential of this area of scientific research.

DEPARTMENT OF OBSTETRICS & GYNAECOLOGY

Dr. Shaun Wynter, MBBS, DGO, Dip. Ven., DM, FRCOG, FACOG – Head of Department

WORK OF THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology is staffed by 3 senior lecturers, 5 lecturers and 8 associate lecturers with 28 associated lecturers spread at 6 off site hospitals. All are involved in clinical teaching, specialist clinical services and research. The clinical areas are general obstetrics and gynaecology and specialist service in Maternal- Fetal Medicine, Gynaecological Oncology and Fertility Management/Assisted Reproduction, and Urogynaecology. The department offers undergraduate and postgraduate courses and have two Fellowship Programmes in Maternal-Fetal Medicine (MFM) and Gynaecological Oncology in association with the International Gynecologic Cancer Society.

Members of the Department are involved in teaching and learning in the undergraduate MBBS programme during years 3, 4 and 5, and the post graduate Doctor of Medicine (DM) programme in Obstetrics and Gynaecology and Fellowship programs. Currently there are 58 post graduate students enrolled in the 4.5 year DM in Obstetrics and Gynaecology programme. There are no fellows in the programs but the application port will be open in December and enrolment is expected in the 2024 academic year. Two Fellows graduated from the Gyn. Onc. Fellowship Programme in 2023.

There are two (2) secretaries, One (1) Senior Medical Technologist and two (2) laboratory attendants in the department.

ACCESS

STUDENTS (UNDERGRADUATE AND POSTGRADUATE)

Students returned to face to face teaching fully. The Clerkships/rotations were shortened with junior students rotating for four instead of five weeks and senior

students rotating for eight instead of ten weeks. This was in an effort to achieve the university mandate to return to regular calendar rotation thus leading to completion of the MBBS program at the pre-COVID time. Teaching and learning are carried out by the different services.

OBSTETRIC PERINATAL SERVICE

This service manages high risk Obstetric cases and accepts referrals from the rest of the island. The Unit provides teaching for postgraduate and undergraduate medical students. Perinatal Audits occur monthly as a joint meeting with the Department of Child Health and annual conference in February of each year is run by the High Risk Obstetric team in collaboration with the Neonatologists & Neonatal Pathologists.

The Labour Ward and Postnatal Services are supervised by consultants Drs. Michelle Campbell and Lenroy Bryan, Dr. Cathy Maddan and Dr Leslie Samuels. These consultants also teach undergraduate and postgraduate students as well as midwives in training.

The Department offers Obstetric Ultrasound Services to both the University Hospital and referrals from outside the University. Ultrasound training is spearheaded by Dr. Nadine Johnson and Dr. Tiffany Hunter.

OBSTETRICS SKILLS & DRILLS

The department offers 2 Emergency Obstetrics Workshops (JOTTIE) each year sponsored by Ferring Pharmaceutical Ltd and offered as a multi-disciplinary training workshop for Anaesthetic Residents, Accident and Emergency Residents, Paediatric Residents, Obstetrics & Gynaecology Residents and midwives from University Hospital and Government Hospitals. It takes place in the simulation lab of the School of Nursing.

ONCOLOGY UNIT

Dr. Taylor & Dr. Bambury are the two trained gynaecological Oncologists in the department and together with Professor Fletcher, Dr. Rattray & Dr. Mitchell & Dr. Medley, form the Gynaecological Oncology Team. They are assisted by Sister Murdoch and her team of Oncology nurses as well as administrative secretary Miss Thompson. Residents rotate through the unit spending 2 months in the Colposcopy and general Oncology areas. Patients requiring colposcopy in the management of the abnormal cervical smear are seen in the Colposcopy clinics while patients with gynaecological malignancies, are seen in the Oncology clinic both in preparation for surgery and for post-surgery follow-up, post chemotherapy and

radiation therapy. The Unit also has facilities for teaching both undergraduate and postgraduate students

FERTILITY MANAGEMENT UNIT

Dr. John Harriott is the acting director of this unit and together with Drs. Shaun Wynter, Loxley Christie, Sharifa Frederick and Michelle Bailey as clinicians, offer assisted reproductive referral services. Other staff members are Fellows Dr Giselle Harrison and Dr Xavier Brown, Miss Denise Everett, a senior embryologist (Biologist) and Miss Hillary Walters, a staff Nurse as the coordinator of the programme. This team has championed the In Vitro Fertilization and Embryo Transfer Programme for Jamaica and the Caribbean. Pregnancy rates continue to improve and frozen embryos and donor eggs are now being stored. Minimally invasive procedures such as hysteroscopy and laparoscopy (both diagnostic and therapeutic procedures) are provided as day case procedures and the family planning clinic offers contraceptive and sterilization advice.
