OVERVIEW

NPI was very pleased to welcome a new academic member of staff, Dr. Ina Vandebroek, who had been a long standing collaborator based at the New York Botanical Gardens. As a highly respected ethnobotanist, Dr. Vandebroek continues her research on Caribbean biodiversity at NPI, while overseeing the herbarium and teaching commitments at the Department of Life Sciences.

This academic year also saw UWI hosting the joint international conference of the Society for Economic Botany (SEB) and the International Society of Ethnobiology (ISE). This hybrid conference hosted 200 participants with 130 visitors face to face from over 30 countries. The conference organizing committee was chaired by Dr. David Picking with extensive support from Dr. Ina Vandebroek and other academic and administrative colleagues from the Faculty (see more details below). Drs. Picking and Vandebroek were the recipients of the President's Award from the SEB for their outstanding service. Other awards during the year included the Anthony N Sabga award for Science and Technology (R. Delgoda).

Strengthened by two new technical staff members (Mr. T Babumon and Ms. L. Wilson), staff and students at NPI engaged in several new projects while also continuing existing research projects. Publication output, grants attracted, conference participation, particularly as keynote speakers, as well as outreach through academic and public fora increased this year.

ACCESS STUDENTS

Two PhD candidates, Foster K, Morrison I, successfully defended their

PhD thesis during this academic year, with the latter receiving a PhD with high commendation (see details below). MPhil thesis submitted by **Wauchope S** has been examined and is expected to be finalized by the end of this academic year. Two others, **Stewart K and Frank C**, are continuing research, while one other, **Richards R**, terminated his newly initiated MPhil for a scholarship offer to commence an MBBS program.
