### **HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WORK IN THE SCHOOL**

**T**he 2015/16 academic year was one of transition and rebuilding for the UWI School of Nursing. During the year in review, the School had some challenges and successes. The Syringa Marshall Burnett Lecture was held on May 27, 2016 in memory of Mrs. Marshall-Burnett who passed on October 10, 2014, and for her contribution to the nursing profession. The Keynote Speaker was Professor Kathryn A. Smith Higuchi, Adjunct Professor, University of Ottawa, Canada. She presented on 'Ensuring Successful Translation of Evidence into Practice', with the goal being to provide insight into the process and factors which ensure the successful transfer of evidence into practice.

The School hosted the The 26th Nursing and Midwifery Research

Conference and 27th Mary J. Seivwright Day on May 26–27, 2016, under the theme “Translating Research Evidence into Best Practices: The key to healthy public and quality patient outcomes”. The Keynote Speaker was Dr. Irmagean Bajnok, Director, Registered Nurses Association of Ontario (RNAO) International Affairs and Best Practice Guidelines Programs and Co-director, Nursing Best Practice Research Centre (NBPRC), Canada. She delivered on Transforming Nursing Through Knowledge: Championing Leaders in Evidence-Based Practice. The presentation highlighted the meaning of evidence based practice, education and management decision making, and why embracing evidence is critically important for nursing and health care today and into the future. There were approximately 225 attendees on each day, which included health care professionals and students from across the region, as well as the United States of America, South Africa and Canada. The Research Conference had a total of seven (7) sessions which featured a total of nineteen (19) Scientific Presentations from nursing professionals, graduate and undergraduate students on both days.

The International Research Internship was held on May 30–June 24, 2016. There were seventeen (17) participants; four of whom were from the Bahamas and one from Trinidad, all other participants were Jamaicans. There were four (4) mentors which included two post doctoral students from the University of Ottawa, Canada. Over the four week period interns attended presentations on conducting research. Each intern was given the opportunity to present their work in progress (WIP) and received feedback from mentors and fellow interns. At the end of the internship each participant was given a certificate of completion with the Continuing Education hours. The participants were asked to evaluate the training on the final day. The internship was held at the UWI School of Nursing, Mona, utilizing the lecture theatres.

The programme was supported by professors throughout the region and was not necessarily focused on nursing but on the broader issue of social determinants of health in the Region. International presenters included: Professor Nancy Edwards, University of Ottawa and Dr. Donald Simeon from the Caribbean Public Health Agency. There were also presenters

from the Faculties of Medical Sciences and Social Sciences, UWI Medical Library as well as from the Planning Institute of Jamaica.

The Global Alliance for Chronic Diseases Implementation Workshop was held on June 8, 2016. This workshop was conducted by Professor Nancy Edwards, Scientific Director of the Canadian Institute of Health Researchers, Institute of Population and Public Health. This event was advertised locally and within the region. A total of 46 individuals registered and attended. The participants included staff from: The UWI, Mona (including UWISON); TMRI, UWI Mona; The Ministry of Health; and The Centre for Chronic Diseases, UWI, Cave Hill.

On December 11, 2015 Mrs Cynthia Pitter (Lecturer, UWISON) and three midwifery educators from Jamaica conducted a one day Competency Based Education workshop with eight (8) participants from Jamaica. On June 19, 2016 the team conducted a second one day workshop at UWISON with twelve (12) MScN (Education) students. This was facilitated by C. Pitter, J. Welsh, P. Lovindeer and J. Brown-Boyd.

The CNNME met on a few times in 2015 under the guidance of Dr. Steve Weaver at the University of the West Indies School of Nursing (UWISON), Mona to revitalize the Network which was dormant and elect a new executive. Attendees were from Nursing and Midwifery education and practice settings within Jamaica. A new executive body was established and persons were elected as Chairs of the Committees of the CARICOM Network for Nursing & Midwifery Education. A meeting of the executive was held in September 2015, where executive members and committee chairpersons were apprised of the terms of reference for each committee.

Some notable students' achievements were that UWISON was again named the Nursing School of the year, Student Nurses were placed 1st and 2nd in the Student Nurse of The Year competition. Additionally, two UWISON students made the Dean's list and the pass rate for the Regional Examination for Nurse Registration (RENr) was increased from 68% to 87%. Two students received IES Scholarships for the 2015/16 Academic year. The UHWI Batch-61 Memorial Scholarship

Award provided a 1000 USD scholarship to one of our students, Miss April Tulloch. The award ceremony was held on May 30, 2015.

The School continues to expand its revenue streams by hosting groups of international students who are required to pay an administrative fee. For the 2015–16 academic year there was an increase in the number of International student visitors.

## **EXTERNAL COLLABORATORS**

### **Institute for the International Education of Students**

Faculty members and students from the Institute for the International Education of Students (IES) visited the School during the periods, December 2015 and April 2016. This was an observational visit where they were placed at three health centres in Kinston and St. Andrew over the period of three days. The IES has contributed significantly to the School's needy fund.

### **Registered Nurses' Association of Ontario (RNAO)**

The UWI School of Nursing is partnering with the RNAO and the University Hospital of the West Indies to implement best practice guidelines to facilitate evidence based nursing care. UWISON was designated as an academic Best Practice Spotlight Organization (BPSO). The University Hospital of the West Indies has also submitted their own application to be designated as a clinical BPSO. UWISON and UHWI are working together on this application process.

### **University of Alberta**

UWISON hosted a group of ten (10) nursing students and one (1) faculty member from the University of Alberta in 2015. The students were engaged in their final practicum course which aimed to further develop and focus their knowledge and application of nursing and practice in their areas of interest. They have successfully completed their course and reported that they enjoyed their experience here.

Additional initiatives aimed at attracting income:

- We will be offering scaling up programmes to British Virgin Island which includes an upgrade from Associate's degree to Bachelor's degree, this will attract revenue.
- The School now has a summer programme which attracts revenues.
- MScN Curriculum Development
  - Adjunct Professor at the University of Ottawa and a Curriculum Specialist, Dr. Kathryn Higuchi, visited UWISON January 12–30, 2015, to provide guidance for the MScN curriculum review. Work is on-going and meetings are being held to complete this activity.
- Preparations for revising and offering the Professional Development Programmes are at an advanced stage.

- Accident and Emergency Care
- Midwifery (The Midwifery Curriculum has been granted approval from the Faculty Board Academic Quality Assurance Committee (AQAC), however, it is being refined for presentation to the Academic Board).
- Communications are well advanced for joint projects in Nursing Educators and Nursing Practitioners between UWISON and Montserrat, Guyana, St. Lucia, Belize, Suriname.

- Proposal from Birmingham City University to facilitate staff and students exchange programme.
- Academic Staff will visit Sweden and Birmingham on exchange programmes.
- Communications are well advanced for joint projects with Montserrat, Belize, Anguilla, St. Lucia and Guyana.

## **PUBLIC SERVICE**

### **Outreach activities contributing to national and international development**

- The School established a ‘needy fund’ to assist in providing support to students; this has been significantly helpful to students.
- Sigma Theta Tau chapter status is currently in review.
- The Head of School is the country representative on the Regional Nursing Body.
- Annual Health fair hosted by UWISON in collaboration with the Caribbean Honor Society of Nursing. Over 120 students received medical examinations for back-to-school.
