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The University of the West Indies, Mona Faculty of Social Sciences June 1 – July 15, 2010 Summer School 2010/11

1. Summer School Overview

Summer School 2011 for the Faculty of Social Sciences (FSS) will run from June 1 - July 15, 2011, inclusive of the examination period. The Weekend School Summer Programme will however, commence on May 28, 2011 and end on July 30, 2011.

Credits for courses passed will be granted to <u>registered UWI students only</u>. Students who register in the Summer School Programme are subject to <u>all Faculty</u> and <u>University</u> regulations. Students are reminded that the Summer School programme is OPTIONAL. Students should therefore be cognizant that arrangements made during Semester1 or Semester 2 do not necessarily hold during the summer period.

Courses that are not fully subscribed will not be offered. To be fully subscribed, a course should have a minimum of twenty five fully paid up students by May 31, 2011. *Students outside the Faculty of Social Sciences are required to consult their respective faculties for required approval before registering for any FSS Summer School course.*

2. Who Can Register

The following categories of students are eligible for admission to the Summer School:

UWI Students:

- Registered students of the University who wish to repeat any of the courses offered.
- Registered students of the University who have not taken the course(s) previously but fall into one of the following categories:
 - Students of the University who have not yet completed the requirements for the degree, diploma or certificate programme for which they are registered.
 - Registered UWI students from other UWI campuses.
- Students of the University who have been granted (a) leave of absence for Semester I and/or 2 preceding the Summer School, or (b) deferral of entry. Such students should register at the start of the Summer School, for Summer School <u>only</u>. <u>Students who are on leave of absence for an entire year and who wish to do summer school are required to pay miscellaneous fees</u>

Non-UWI Students:

• Other persons, who are not students of the University, who are eligible to matriculate at either the normal or lower level are eligible for admission to the Summer School Programme. (These students must register in the **Summer School programme** and also with the **Admissions Section** of the University as *Specially Admitted Students*).

4. Academic Integrity

Students have the responsibility to know and observe the Regulations of The University of the West Indies and the Faculty of Social Sciences. Additionally the regulations prohibit plagiarism, falsification of information and academic dishonesty. All university and faculty regulations are in force during the Summer School programme.

5. Attendance

A **<u>MINIMUM ATTENDANCE OF 75%</u>** of Lectures/Tutorials is required. The teaching materials and course outlines are available at the beginning of the Summer School Programme and also upon request. Please contact your department's summer school coordinator or the departmental summer school web-site for further information.

6. Course Selection and Registration (UWI Students)

- a. A student is deemed to be fully registered for the Summer Programme when the student has fulfilled his/her financial obligations to the University.
- b. All Faculty of Social Sciences Students should register for no more than two (2) courses in summer school 2011.
- c. All Faculty Bulletins, Notices, Information Guide, Course Timetable and Registration materials for Summer School 2011 will be available online and through the departmental

offices.

- d. Course Selection will be carried out via the Internet at the Web sitehttp://sas.uwimona.edu.jm:9010/pls/data_mona/twbkwbis.P_GenMenu?name=homepage
- e. Tuition Payment can be made at the Bursary Cashier, NCB, BillExpress, PayMaster or via UWI *eCommerce* at <u>https://eservices.mona.uwi.edu/finserv/tuition/</u>.

- g. Payments can be made by cash, Manager's Cheque, Credit or Debit Card. Students who make payment using *eCommerce* do so with a credit card. Students are *NOT* required to present a voucher for payment. For more information about payment options, please see http://www.mona.uwi.edu/studinfo/fees/
- h. Students from the Faculties of <u>Humanities & Education</u> and <u>Pure & Applied Sciences</u> who wish to pursue courses in the Faculty of Social Sciences *should seek permission from their faculty before paying* for these courses.
- i. <u>Exams Only</u> Only those students who have been notified in writing that they are allowed to do *Exams Only* can apply to register in this category. Students with appropriate notification should apply for Exams Only through their respective Faculty Coordinator or the Faculty Office.
- j. <u>Timetable</u> Students who are pursuing more than one course, should choose carefully and register for *only one course in any one time slot*. Refunds will not be granted for any "clashed course" save where there has been a *timetable change* resulting in the clash.

7. Timetable

The Summer School timetable is a composite timetable indicating all courses offered by the departments in the Faculty of Social Sciences. This timetable will be available online on each department's web-site. Students should note that each course on the timetable appears in one of three 2-hour slots, labeled *Slot A, Slot B, Slot C* respectively. Therefore each course meets 3 times per week for a total of six hours. See page 14 below.

- a. Summer School courses are offered in one of three time slots students should choose carefully and register for *only one course in any one slot*.
- b. The Summer School timetable is available online on each department's website. Please see section 15 for departments' website.

8. Course Selection and Registration for Specially Admitted Students

- a. If you are not currently a student of the UWI you should register for a summer course as a "<u>Specially Admitted</u>" student. You are required to download a copy of the <u>Special</u> Admissions Form from http://www.mona.uwi.edu/admissions/specially_admitted.php
- b. Complete the Admission Application Form, obtain approval from the relevant department(s) and return approved application to the Admission Section, Registry.
- c. Persons applying for Special Admission who have never been registered students at the University of the West Indies are required to submit application documents (birth certificate, academic certificates etc) along with the application form.
- d. Fees Specially Admitted students are required to pay for *Tuition and Miscellaneous Fees* as per the schedule below

10. Examinations, Course Load

Students can register for a **maximum of THREE courses** within the FSS (including *Exams Only*). Students are advised to check the timetable before registering. Examination procedures will be the same as those that apply for the end of semester examinations. Some courses may have a course work component.

11. Registration Changes/ Adjustments

Students who wish to adjust their registration are allowed to do so on-line up to June 1, 2011. Changes to registration during the first week of June are allowed through Summer School Departmental Coordinators. These changes will be only accommodated where the exam results have been posted in this period and students wish to repeat a failed course based on the list published. Changes to registration after June 7, 2010 can only be made by Academic Board, (through a student's Faculty Office). These adjustments/ changes will only be allowed in exceptional circumstances. (*Please see Undergraduate Student handbook*)

12. Withdrawal

Students may withdraw from a course in the normal period, up to June 1, 2011, by notifying the Faculty Office in writing, and copying the Campus Registrar and the Summer School Coordinator. The student should clearly state the reason for the withdrawal and complete the required *application form for refund where applicable*. Students who wish to withdraw from a course after June 7, 2010, must apply to Academic Board, through their respective Faculty Office. Adjustment to registration will *only be allowed in exceptional circumstances* beyond June 7. Students who withdraw from a course after June 7, 2011 will *not be refunded any portion of fees*.

13. **Refund Policy**

Request for refunds should be submitted on the Refund Application Form at the Customer Services Section no later than June 12, 2010.

A refund penalty is charged as follows:

- No penalty before June 1, 2011 .
- 25% of fees up to June 12, 2011
- 50% of fees up to June 19, 2011.
- <u>Requests submitted after June 19, 2011 will NOT be processed and NO Refund will be</u> granted.
- NO Refunds will be granted to students who sat Course Work and or Final Examinations.
- Students who complete their payment (with special arrangement) after June 19, 2010 are not eligible for a refund.

Notwithstanding the above, students who have registered and fully paid for courses which have been cancelled will receive a full refund of tuition fees paid.

15. **Payment of Fees**

Cash, Manager's cheques, Debit and Credit cards will be accepted as payment for Summer School courses. There is a penalty for cheques which are 'returned to drawer'. Part payment of fees is NOT allowed.

 Fee Payment can be made at the UWI Registry Cashier (Debit/Credit card), BillExpress, Paymaster or via UWI eCommerce at https://www.mona.uwi.edu/finserv/tuition/. Students who make payment using *eCommerce* do so with a credit card. Payments using any of

the methods listed above, require no voucher collection from Customer Services.

• Fees can also be paid at the National Commercial Bank (NCB). Students are required to select their course(s) online before making payment.
